Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available.

\*\* While MATH 1332, 1342 and 1350 will fulfill core math requirements, they will NOT prepare students for higher-level math courses such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 1316) or Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412).  
\*\*\* Or an equivalent course (second year, second semester) in a foreign language.  
\*\*\*\* All students will compile and submit a Senior Portfolio to fulfill requirement for this degree.  
\*\*\*\*\* No additional courses can be taken when students are enrolled in student teaching EDSE 4340 and 4341 during their final semester.  
NOTE: At least 39 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. **Broadcast Journalism majors may not count more than 43 hours of MCOM courses toward the degree**; and no more than six hours in religion (RELI) and six hours in physical education (PHED) can be counted toward a degree.  
^Transfer & WT GPA combined must be 2.75.
